Bill Clark gave an outstanding discussion and demonstration of his methods of turnings enhancement. Bill held the attention and answered numerous questions from the attending members on how he accomplishes his beautiful turnings. The cost of equipment to accomplish his turning enhancements is expensive but the results are well worth the costs. Several AVWA members voiced a desire to attempt some of Bill's techniques. Bill covered branding, texturing, and piercing. He makes his own tips and brands from nichrome and gave the address where this metal can be

obtained at a reasonable cost as well as pyrographic, texturing, and piercing equipment. One of the piercing tools he demonstrated rotates at 350,000 RPM! He also covered the hazards of the equipment and processes and what safety gear is needed.
