Dan put on a great demonstration on turning a finial box . He was inspired by the work of Cindy Drozda whose work is highlighted in the latest issue of American Woodturner magazine. Martin helped Dan with the addition of a turquoise ring.

Dan had a large audience for the demonstration. The demonstrations at the bi-monthly meeting is always a great way to learn new techniques.



After turning the outside shape Dan gets ready to start the inside by using a drill with a stop to bore a hole.

Martin checks out Dan's technique for boring the center out of the box. In this case the box is more like a vessel but the technique is the same
